- While with both Stone Energy and Mariner Energy, Lisa served as a legal advisor to all corporate, technical and operational departments, ranging from the regular, day-today to matters arising in connection with company-significant exploration, development and operational activities.
- Lisa was actively involved with the companies' credit facilities and indentures and
 other private and public capital raises, financial reporting matters (including annual
 reports and annual proxy statements), contract negotiations and contracts
 management, claims and litigation management, risk management, regulatory and
 other legal compliance matters, and advising on special projects.

- For both companies, Lisa advised on all company-significant mergers, acquisitions
 and divestitures, as well as key joint ventures and strategic partner trades for material
 asset interests.
- As Senior Vice President, General Counsel and Corporate Secretary for Stone Energy Corporation, Lisa introduced, designed and managed a revitalized company-wide, full-scope legal department, championing the legal function as a value-adding partner.

- Lisa worked closely with Stone Energy's CEO, CFO and principal accounting officer and their teams, as well as outside tax, financial, legal and other advisors, on the company's capital raises, its bank and other debt facilities, financial reporting matters (annual reports, current reports, annual proxy statements, and other matters) and corporate governance matters (including exchange and regulatory compliance and shareholder and proxy advisory firm outreach).
- Lisa regularly advised the Stone Energy board of directors and its committees, including the board's compensation committee (annual compensation, annual proxy statement and special compensation arrangements associated with reorganization and sale of the company), its nominating and governance committee (director nominations and onboarding, succession planning and general governance considerations) and the board's special committees created to evaluate strategic alternatives.
- While with Stone Energy, and commencing with the decline in commodity prices in late 2014, Lisa coordinated and managed all legal aspects of the company's varied efforts to address the effects of these significant price declines, which efforts lead to negotiations with unsecured noteholders, secured creditors and other stakeholders and concluded in a pre-arranged Chapter 11 bankruptcy filing, with an auction sale of the company's Appalachian Basin assets. Upon the company's exit from bankruptcy in February 2017, Lisa continued to support the company and its new board of directors, and to work with the company's executive team and its financial and legal advisors, to assess strategic alternatives, culminating in the sale and merger of the company in May 2018.
- Lisa joined Mariner Energy in 2005 to support the company's acquisition of the Gulf of Mexico Shelf assets of Forest Oil Corporation and the company going public on the NYSE. As Assistant General Counsel and Assistant Secretary with Mariner, among other matters, Lisa supported the deepwater team on the company's Gulf of Mexico deepwater projects as well as the company's Permian Basin team in the course of growing the company's position and activities in the basin; she advised on company-significant offshore and onshore asset acquisitions and divestitures; advised on all offshore regulatory matters (including legal compliance matters arising from

the Macondo/Deepwater Horizon event in 2010); and provided legal support on the company's borrowing base revolving credit facility.

• Lisa also was actively engaged in providing legal advice and counsel through Mariner Energy the sale of Mariner Energy to Apache Corporation in 2010.
